Solivia **IRMA CHALLENGES THE NORM**

Water isn't easy to come by in the community of Contorno Pallcoso. A prolonged drought and environmental pollution have affected many of the households in the area. Irma Delia and her large family of seven children and many grandchildren were among those deeply affected.

Fortunately, there was hope. In collaboration with the CHOICE Bolivia team, the community launched a drinking water system project with plumbing workshops. Culturally, it's men who typically participate in this type of trade work, but Irma had other plans. She challenged the gender stereotypes by joining a cohort of women plumbers and taking upon herself her own home's water installation. "The trade that I'm learning is for my own person. I have the capacity, I know that I can, and I will continue to learn."

Ecuador **DOING BUSINESS BETTER WITH PACHAMAMA**

It's all smiles for the Pachamama Women's Association, a group of 25 entrepreneurs who are proud to support their families. In the beautiful region of San Pablo—where tourism is an economic opportunity—these women sell agriculture harvests, embroidery handicrafts, and costume jewelry to tourists at the local artisan market. However, Pachamama wanted to take things to the next level in their workplace.

They enrolled in the Industrial Safety and Occupational Health course offered at Inta Kara, a vocational training center developed by CHOICE Humanitarian and the ASEA Advancing Life Foundation. Through this program, the entrepreneurs learned best practices to improve safety in their production facility. Soon after, they installed informative signage, a first aid kit, and a fire extinguisher. Pachamama expressed gratitude to CHOICE and ASEA for providing training resources to improve their business.



Q Guatemala **A DREAM WITHIN REACH FOR PABLO**

In the rural community of Rinconcito del Norte, Pablo May serves his local church congregation. Together with his family, this 40-year-old man has faced the challenges that come with living in an impoverished area. He didn't have the opportunity to study as a child, and that has held him back from achieving the title of pastor, a role that requires fundamental education. He dreams of finishing his studies at the primary level. With CHOICE's involvement, those dreams now have a chance.

For the past two years, Pablo has been studying at the National Institute of Radio Education (IGER). This program brings educational opportunities to underserved community members, and CHOICE Humanitarian works with IGER as a collaborative partner. Pablo shared that he is grateful for the teachers who have always been there to guide him in his activities and exercises. He commented, "I'm very grateful to CHOICE for giving me the opportunity to change my life."



Kenya THE RIPPLE EFFECT OF EDUCATION

Education is a powerful tool to break cycles of poverty. CHOICE Humanitarian helped put this into action by fully sponsoring 16 gifted students through a scholarship program. Additionally, CHOICE extended support to 75 more students through the Community-Based Trust Fund Program (COBETF), a collaborative initiative involving CHOICE, local organizations, and various development partners. To further maximize impact, CHOICE matched any local contributions with a 1:2 ratio, a shining example of leveraging local resources.

Previous scholarship student recipients, Esther and Wewa, now give back to their communities by hosting educational clinics and tutoring sessions during holidays. **Their mission is to pay it forward and inspire the next generation of scholars from their community.**

• Mexico TEACHING A COMMUNITY TO FISH

Like the old proverb advises, CHOICE is in the business of "teaching people to fish." In the community of Mesa de Chosto, the CHOICE Mexico team is providing exactly that through aquaponics.

Aquaponics is an innovative system that combines the cultivation of fish and vegetables. Six community members of the local Mazahua tribe operate this particular project. Even with challenges such as a language barrier and learning a new technology, this motivated group has gained skills for a sustainable livelihood. Not only are they proficient aquaponics operators, but they're also successful entrepreneurs. The participants sell their produce at the local market, and they're proud to offer a variety of vegetables and fish species. **With these skills, this empowered community is ready to thrive.**

Nepal generational change for thull & Her neighbors

Can you imagine hauling your daily water on your back? In Thaha municipality, generations have trekked across steep, rocky hills to collect water from a stream an hour and a half away. Not only is the lack of safe water detrimental to residents' health, but it also affects other areas of family life. Parents spend their mornings fetching water and are unable to prepare their children to attend school. The kids then go to class on empty stomachs or drop out altogether, which exacerbates the poverty cycle.

Fortunately, in partnership with CHOICE, the community constructed a technology-based running water system. All 17 households in the area—plus a school—now have water nearby. The community is optimistic about the changes this will bring.

Community member Thuli Thing reflected on the previous hardships and shared this: "Many generations spent their lives carrying water on their back. I can hardly believe my eyes that we can get water just by opening the faucet established in our yard."

Peru carmen emerges as a leader

Carmen Cárcamo overheard that an organization named CHOICE Humanitarian was helping empower women in a neighboring community. In her own community of Monte Castillo, 80% of the population lives in poverty. Carmen has faced obstacles because of the lack of resources. She grew up without an education, and it's been difficult to support her family. When she heard about CHOICE, she knew it was a turning point.

She joined the Asociación Milagro de Jesús, a women's association supported by CHOICE. Together with 23 hardworking associates, she has learned how to start a livestock business and produce meat to sell for additional income.

The association is more than just revenue. These incredible women are gaining confidence and self-reliance. Carmen was even elected as president of the group. She expressed, "I am a leader for my family and my husband respects me for how strong I have been. I feel very blessed to have met CHOICE and its team, and I now have a chance at a better future for my children."




